A CASE OF THEFT - BE WATCHFUL

Sometime between January 14 and March 11, the Sorrento Fire Department had stolen slightly over 200 gallons of heating fuel. By the time it was noticed that the tank was nearly empty, with all the snow we had this winter, there were little signs of footprints or tire tracks. The State Police are looking into the matter. Be sure every winter to keep close watch of your heating fuel, especially if you are away for any length of time.



Beginning May 1, you must once again put your trash bags into trash cans for pick up, as per our town ordinance.

Harris Disposal has been told not to

pick up trash bags without most of the bags having been put into trash cans. If your <u>cans</u> are full, one or two bags may be placed on top or beside the cans.

Some notes from Harris: TAKE NOTE!!!

****All** small items **must** be bagged, boxed or bundled.

**No tires with rims.

**Carpeting must be tied in rolls not exceeding 80 lbs.

**No harzardous or flammable liquids, or used motor oil.

**Scraps longer than 4ft. will not be picked up.
Items weighing **in excess of 80 lbs. will not be picked up.

**Do not put broken glass or sharp objects in plastic bags. Put it in a suitable container or box!!!

REMEMBER!!! – IF YOU NEED TO CONTACT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR DOWNED TREES AND/OR WIRES OR WHATEVER EMERGENCY (fire, police, ambulance), YOU NEED TO

CALL 9-1-1.

The Fire Department will be toned out by Hancock County Dispatch. There is no number to contact the Fire Department directly – you need to call 9-1-1.

NOTE FROM THE SULLIVAN TOWN OFFICE:

Sorrento residents have to go to the Sorrento Town Office <u>FIRST</u> and pay the excise tax on the vehicle you are registering. Motor Vehicle in Augusta says towns are not supposed to accept excise from other towns.

IF YOU COME TO SULLIVAN BEFEORE PAYING YOUR EXCISE TAX IN SORRENTO, YOU WILL BE SENT BACK TO SORRENTO.



SALT WATER FISHING

Anyone 16 years of age or older who wishes to fish recreationally in saltwater needs to register in Maine. Customers will be able to register for free at the same time that they purchase their freshwater fishing license. MAKE SURE WHEN YOU PURCHASE YOUR FRESHWATER FISHING LICENSE THAT YOU ASK FOR THE SALTWATER FISHING TO BE MARKED ALSO, IF YOU WISH TO SALTWATER FISH.

You should have your freshwater fishing license with you when fishing in saltwater to prove you have registered in Maine.

A person who wishes to fish in saltwater who does not want to purchase a fresh water fishing license must register on the Saltwater Registry. This is done on the regular license form. The state fee is \$0 and the agent/town fee is \$2. A person who wishes to purchase the Salt Water Registry item is required to provide a phone number.

If you are purchasing any other item on the license form, the fee for the salt water registry is \$0 for the state and \$0 for the agent/town.

LAND USE/BUILDING ORDINANCE

Don't forget Sorrento's Land Use/Building

Ordinance. This ordinance is for property that would fall outside of the Shoreland Zoning area and therefore the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. A copy of this ordinance can be picked up in the lobby of the Town Office.

If you are unsure if you need to apply for a permit, call John Fuhrman, Sorrento's Code Enforcement Officer, 963-2363. Failure to get a permit if needed can result in penalties and other costs.

MAINE SHORELAND ZONING HANDBOOKS

Shoreland Owners

Any Sorrento property owners who own shoreland here in Sorrento may come in to pick up this handbook.

For any differences between this handbook and the Sorrento Shoreland Ordinance, the Sorrento Shoreland Ordinance overrides the handbook.

A copy of the **Sorrento Shoreland Ordinance** can be purchased for **\$5** or you can just look at a copy in the office if you do not wish to purchase one.

THE 2012 PROPERTY TAXES were due January 25, 2013. The lien process has now been completed. Liens have been placed on the unpaid properties and mortgage holders have been notified.

The liens on the 2011 unpaid property taxes were recorded in the Hancock County Registry of Deeds and mortgage holders were notified. These taxes will be due August, 2014.

The 2013 property tax bills were mailed and they were <u>due January 21, 2014.</u> Interest on unpaid taxes is now accruing.

MAINE RESIDENTS PROPERTY TAX & RENT REFUND PROGRAM

This program has been repealed and replaced by a Refundable Property Tax Fairness Credit that can be claimed on the Maine Income Tax Form.

Starting January 14, 2014 on the 2013 Maine Individual Income Tax Form 1040ME, a worksheet will be included to calculate the amount of the credit.

HOMEOWNERS OR **RENTERS** WILL ELICIBLE WHO **MEET ALL** OF FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS: Residents during any part of the tax year; owned or rented and lived in a home in Maine during any part of the tax year; had Maine adjusted gross income of not more than \$40,000; paid property tax on a home during the tax year that was more than 10% of your adjusted gross income, or paid rent that was more than 40% of your adjusted gross income.

TO NEW LAND OWNERS OR OLD LAND OWNERS – If you have bought or sold a portion of a lot of land, a map of the new division of the properties needs to be sent to the Selectmen/Assessors.

CONCEALED WEAPON PERMITS

As of February 27, 2008, concealed weapon permit renewals and first-time applications now go through the **Maine State Police**, not the Town of Sorrento. If you need a first-time application or a renewal application, please call **624-7210** or go on line to maine.gov.

VITAL RECORDS – As of July 12, 2010 certified records of birth, marriage, & death increased from \$10 to \$15 and marriage licenses increased from \$30 to \$40. The State sets these rates.

AVAILABLE IN THE TOWN OFFICE

4" X 5" orange identification stickers for canoes, kayaks or rowboats. They have <u>IF FOUND - CONTACT</u> and space for your name and phone number.





All 2013 **BOAT REGISTRATIONS** expired on December 31. <u>MOST</u> of the 2014 boat registration renewals (those registered after July 1, 2013 will not have renewals sent to this office from Augusta so please bring your 2013 registrations here with you when you come in to do your 2014 renewals) have been received from the State by this office.



Also...

If you own a **<u>DOCUMENTED BOAT</u>** there is no yearly registration fee. But there is a <u>vearly boat excise</u> <u>fee</u> (for which you are issued a boat excise sticker-similar to a boat registration sticker), payable to the town. This documented boat excise fee is due within 10 days of operation on State waters, or prior to July 1st of each year.

When you come in to pay your boat excise tax, please bring your documentation certificate with you. There will also be a Documented Boat Excise Tax Form for you to fill out. One can be sent to one if you call and let this office know.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE

Whether you register your boat(s) and get registration stickers, or your boat is documented and you only get excise stickers, these stickers need to be put on the boat, in the correct areas.

THIS IS STATE LAW.

MOORINGS AND ROWBOATS

Applications for mooring and rowboat permits have been mailed. If you do not receive one and would like one mailed to you, please call the town office.

<u>ALL Sorrento waters</u> come under the Sorrento Harbor Ordinance, <u>so all moorings in all Sorrento waters</u> will pay a fee.

Mooring inspection: is **EVERY 3 YEARS.**

2014 DOG LICENSES

**Dogs must be licensed January 1 or when they reach 6 months of age.

A list of all unlicensed dogs will be given to the Animal Control Officers. You may be issued a summons and may need to go to court and this will cost you more than the \$25 late fee.

If you license your dog(s) <u>after January 31</u> you will pay a <u>\$25 late fee</u> per dog along with the license fee.

**When licensing your dog, you must bring with you your dog's <u>rabies certificate showing the tag number</u> and <u>date of expiration</u> and your <u>certificate of proof of spay or neuter</u>, unless these are already on file at the Town Office.

**If you lived and paid for your dog's license/tag in another town in Maine and now live in Sorrento, you must come in to the Town Office and exchange for a Sorrento license/tag.

**Any dog living in the Town of Sorrento must have a

Spayed/neutered dog fee - \$6.00 Unaltered dog fee - \$11.00

PLEASE INFORM THE TOWN OFFICE IF YOU NO LONGER OWN A DOG. Thank you.

NOTE!!

DOGS: If you have a complaint about a dog(s) being on your property, running loose, barking, etc., you must sign a complaint form. This form states that you may be called to court to testify. Your name can be kept private until court time. If the person involved contacts you, this is witness tampering and can be addressed.

PET CARRIERS – If you have any pet carriers, small or large, that you would like to get rid of, please call the Animal Control Officers.

S.A.F.E. (Sullivan Animal Food Eatery): This is s pet food pantry that is open to residents of Sullivan and surrounding towns, **including Sorrento.** If you are having trouble making ends meet and feeding your pets, contact Kristine at the Sullivan Town Hall, 422-6282. The pet food, both dry and wet, for dogs and cats is available at the Sullivan Town Hall during business hours. **Donations are gratefully accepted.**

Voucher Program for Spay/Neuter:

Voucher program through the SPCA Animal Shelter and

The Ark if you need help with spaying/neutering your animals. They will pay 1/3, a participating vet will pay 1/3 and you pay 1/3. Please don't hesitate to ask for help. Call the SPCA at 667-8088 or The Ark at 546-3484 and ask for a voucher. You make the appointment, they fax the voucher to the vet., you take your pet in.

MAINE LAW NOW REQUIRES THAT ALL CATS MUST HAVE RABIES SHOTS.

There is no registration or license or fee as dogs have. But if an Animal Control Officer or other law officer asks to see your cat's rabies certificate for any reason, you must show them the rabies certificate.

CATS: If you have been feeding stray cats, it becomes **your** responsibility to take care of them, not the town's.



FOSTER HOMES FOR CATS

From the Sorrento Fire Department



On June 4 and 5, 2014 the Sorrento Fire Department will be conducting required yearly hose testing. This will take place on Waukeag Ave., from Mt. Desert St. to Beech St., and that area will be closed to all traffic, probably for most of those days.

Sorrento's mutual aid towns of Franklin, Hancock, Sullivan and Winter Harbor will also be participating.

SORRENTO FIRE DEPARTMENT PREPLAN

There is a form at the end of this newsletter that is titled the <u>'Sorrento Fire Department Preplan'</u>. The Fire Department is asking that you fill this out and

return it to the Town Office. This is, of course, voluntary and not required.

The information on this form is not public information and will only be used by the Fire Department. The information includes your name and address, caretaker of key holder, oil or propane company, alarm company, kind of driveway (long, steep, small), if you have a sprinkler system, and other information that would help the fire department if you had a fire or other problem at your home. There is also a check off in anyone has mobility issues or special needs and number of adults and children in the home and ages.

All of this information will give the fire department as much of a heads up as possible in case of any type of emergency at your home.

Again, completing this form is not required and is only voluntary.

STATE BURNING PERMITS

Maine is making is easier for homeowners to clean up and dispense with fallen limbs and other backyard brush from this year's winter storms. In early April, the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry's Bureau of Forestry announced that it had expanded its burn permit system statewide. Traditional hand-written burn permits are still available, but the online system allows permits to be acquired 24 hours a day, seven days a week, throughout the state provided that the fire danger is not high.

Unlike the previous system, revenues will now be shared with the municipality where the burn will occur (\$2 out of the \$7 charge). When permits are issued, the system also can notify up to 20 town fire wardens and fire department personnel with emails or text messages. Online burn permits can be obtained at any time and are valid for 48 hours after payment has been submitted. The fire chief or town warden for each municipality may impose further restrictions on allowable burn times or needed personnel and equipment. FIRE PERMITS

All commercial burn permits expired on April 15.

You are required by Maine law to have a permit to burn, even for a small pile of grass clippings or leaves. A Forestry Warden will be called if you burn without a permit, possibly resulting in you being summonsed to court and fined.

The person who signs the fire permit is responsible for the fire. Do not leave any fire unattended.

Required for burning:

- **at least two adults to attend the burn,
- **some form of water supply and hand tools must be on hand,
- **and it is recommended you have a cellular phone or other communication device to call for assistance should the fire escape.

YOU are responsible to see that the fire is out before leaving.

Lisa welcomed new Planning Board member Dan Bierman, Jr.

John Fuhrman explained his process for permitting. He would like to continue the process whereby he will issue all permits and send us copies to review. John Dedam pointed out that such a process does not comply with Sorrento's ordinance when the value of the project is above \$10,000. We gather that we will need to get the citizens to vote for a change to the ordinance to allow Fuhrman to issue the permits for projects greater than \$10,000. We need to discuss further what the Planning Board will do in the interim. Meanwhile we are allowing John Fuhrman to continue his practice.

In recent years most of the permits that are granted are for additions to existing structures or for accessory structures.

Dan asked about the existence of a Comprehensive Plan for Sorrento. Connie insisted that there is one voted in the early 2000s. Dan had been at an HCPC talk where it was suggested that there is value (in getting grants) for having and updating a Comprehensive Plan. Lisa will ask Esther to share copies of the Plan with the Planning Board so that we can review it.

We plan to use the May meeting to review the Sorrento ordinances. John Fuhrman suggested that we consider adding a Property Maintenance ordinance like one that Ellsworth recently adopted. Lisa will track down a copy of the Ellsworth ordinance either on-line or via phone with Laurie Robbins. John and Dan wondered whether we want to consider adopting a subdivision ordinance designed for Sorrento.

April Report

This month was busy and eventful. We had a flood closure in effect the first week of this month. We also had some new conservation closures that went into effect on the first of the month which caused some confusion and a lot of phone calls to me. I also sent out a mailing to all the harvesters that had all the new closure dates and maps explaining the boundary lines and where the boundary post that I put I are for reference.

This month I issued 3 summonses to harvesters. 1 was for harvesting clams in a closed conservation area, 1 for Aiding and abetting a harvester by selling his clams and 1 for selling clams with a Recreation license w/o a state license. None of these guys gave me a hard time when I summonsed them. Details are in E-card at EPD.

I put signs up at all the access points at the new closures and set posts for boundary line references. I had a problem with someone pulling out the post in Raccoon Cove 3 times. I haven't set a new one yet because I am going to set a metal weighted post when I get time.

The harvesters have been digging legal clams and their percentage for small clams was no higher than 3 percent on any of the harvesters I've checked this month. Most of our diggers are calling me when they see some illegal activity but the majority of them will not fill out a witness statement because they don't want to be labeled a rat.

I have spent some time stopping at resident's homes that are on the shores at the closures and giving them my phone number and telling them the area is closed to all digging and if they see anyone digging to call me. I also stressed that all the calls will be confidential. I have been getting calls from these residents already but the diggers were worm diggers.

We have had conservation events almost every week and most of the harvesters have all of their hours to renew their license. We still have a few events left so the harvesters still have time to get all their hours.

I had an oil change on the truck this month and it is running good.

SHELLFISH ORDINANCE Frenchman Bay Regional Shellfish Conservation Ordinance



If you would like to harvest shellfish in Sorrento, a commercial or recreational shellfish license is required.

The licenses run from July 1 to June 30. "Peck" or recreational licenses may be purchased at the Sorrento Town Hall. A resident recreational license is \$6.00; a non-resident recreational license is \$11.00; 16 years and under and 65 years and older is only the \$1.00 agent fee. Resident commercial licenses must be purchased at the Ellsworth City Hall. Non-resident commercial licenses are awarded annually by lottery.

A copy of the ordinance may be obtained in the lobby of the Sorrento Town Hall or at Ellsworth City Hall.

Shellfish warden Mike Hall is routinely patrolling the shoreline. Violators will be prosecuted for noncompliance. Local harvesters will work with DMR and other parties to work on conservation measures.

When used in the context of this new ordinance, the words "shellfish", "clams" and "intertidal shellfish resources" mean **soft shell clams** (Mya arenaria), **quahogs** (Mercenaria mercenaria), **razor clams** (Ensis directus), **hen clams** (Spisula solidissima), **eatern oysters** (Crassostrea virginica) and **European Oysters** (Ostrea edulis).

Get your trash out early!

Each trash bag must have a Sorrento trash sticker on it-bags without stickers will not be picked up. Put the bags in trash cans. Per our contract with Harris Disposal, the trash bags are not to exceed 40 pounds in weight when full.

<u>The Sullivan Town Office says –</u> <u>Message from the Sullivan Town Office –</u>

Sorrento residents have to go to the Sorrento Town Office FIRST and pay the excise tax owed on your vehicle. Motor

Vehicle in Augusta says towns are not supposed to accept excise from other towns. IF YOU COME TO SULLIVAN BEFORE PAYING YOUR EXCISE TAX IN SORRENTO, YOU WILL BE SENT BACK.

When you come to the Sullivan Town Office to complete your vehicle registration, <u>make sure to have your insurance card</u> (it must show date of expiration). They must see your insurance card!

Excise Tax: Excise tax on your vehicle <u>must be paid in</u> the town you live in BEFORE you go to Sullivan or wherever you get your registration.

When registering a vehicle, you must have your insurance card and mileage with you. You must have your INSURANCE CARD, not your insurance bill (this is State law!). If you complete your registration in Sullivan, you can have a copy of your insurance card faxed from your insurance company to the Sullivan Town Office at 422-4785.

When you pay your excise to the Town of Sorrento, you will receive 2 copies (a white copy and a yellow copy) of your registration needed to take to Sullivan (or wherever you complete your registration). Please fill out the white copy before coming in to Sullivan. This will save time.

Also, if you are required to file SR22 insurance you will need to go to Ellsworth to register your vehicle after you pay your excise in your town
