The caller will receive a return call for the purpose of picking up the outdated or unwanted marine flares for proper disposal.

# TAKE NOTE BURNING TRASH IS ILLEGAL!!

State Laws (12 MRSA 9321-25) governing the backyard burning of household trash are enforced by the Maine Forest Service.

If you think someone is burning trash <u>please call 973-3700</u> <u>immediately!</u> 24 hours/day, 7 days a week.

### TAKE NOTE

Due to changes from Augusta as to how marriage licenses and copies of birth, marriage and death certificates are done, this notice is to inform you that, especially with marriage licenses, we will **need at least three business days** from the time you give us your completed intentions papers to the time you may pick up your marriage license or other copies.

The <u>2018 PROPERTY TAX BILLS</u> were <u>due by</u> <u>January 7, 2019</u> with interest at 8% per annum charged after that date. The lien process has begun on any unpaid 2018 property taxes.

Any unpaid 2018 property taxes will be set to lien the first week of November 2019.

2020 DOG LICENSES will

be available October 15, 2019.



They will be due by January 1, 2020.
Starting February 1, the State charges a \$25 late fee per dog, along with the license fee.

\*\*Dogs must be licensed by January 1
or when they reach 6 months of age.
\$11 for male or female dogs
\$6 for neutered male or spayed female.

In March 2020, the list of unlicensed dogs will be given to the Animal Control Officer. Along with the extra \$25 State fee per dog, you may be summonsed to court, which can incur additional costs.

If you license your dog(s) <u>after January 31</u> (unless it is a new dog), you will pay a \$25 late fee per dog

along with the license fee, per State law.

\*\*When licensing your dog, you must bring with you your dog's <u>Maine rabies certificate showing the tag number and date of expiration</u> and your <u>certificate of proof of spay or neuter</u>, unless these are already on file at the Town Office.

\*\*If you lived and paid for your dog's license/tag in another town in Maine and now live in Sorrento, you must come in to the Town Office and exchange for a Sorrento license/tag. There is no fee for this.

\*\*Any dog living in the Town of Sorrento must have a

Sorrento license/tag.

Motion to approve Meeting Minutes from last meeting: Approved

Crosby Noves: There have been complaints that the current lighting at the town pier is too powerful and blinding to residents, boaters, and even complaints from Hancock as to the light pollution. Crosby presented a proposal and report for a new main light system to be placed underneath the current system. The new system has shields to direct the light and the intensity of the light is controllable. The current system would be available in the event of an emergency and would be turned on by an unlocked outdoor switch that would be easily assessable. Crosby received a high and low quote from his electrician. He contacted residents who are affected by the current light system and they are willing to pay the costs for purchase and installation. Currently, \$1,550 has been committed to this project by private donations. The total cost of the project is between \$1,600 and \$1,800. The Electrician is Dave Green in Hancock. The Selectmen will make a decision on this at the November  $6^{th}$  meeting.

The Fire department needs a computer. The construction of the new desk is almost complete.

Snow removal for the town hall complex has been done by Jake Belhumeur and he will do the snow removal again this year. He is only able to clear snow from the town hall complex in the mornings.

# STATE BURNING PERMITS

Traditional hand-written burn permits are still available, but the state online system allows permits to be acquired 24 hours a day, seven days a week, throughout the state, provided that the fire danger is not high. These you pay for. You don't pay for burn permits issued by the below fire department members.

# Commercial burn permits are available October 15 thru April 15.

Regular burn permits are available year-round.

# FOR BURN PERMITS ANY TIME OF THE YEAR:

You are required by Maine law to have a permit to burn, even for a small pile of grass clippings or leaves. A Forestry Warden will be called if you burn without a permit, possibly resulting in you being summonsed to court and fined.

The person who signs the fire permit is responsible for the fire. Do not leave any fire unattended.

# Required for burning:

- \*\*at least two adults to attend the burn,
- \*\*some form of water supply and hand tools must be on hand,
- \*\*and it is recommended you have a cellular phone or other communication device to call for assistance should the fire escape.

# YOU are responsible to see that the fire is out before leaving.

# **EXPIRATION DATES**

<u>VEHICLES:</u> Expire a year from when they are registered (unless you are transferring)

TRAILERS: Can be registered for 1 or 2 years, same month, except over 2000 lb. trailers expire

in Feb. (1 or 2 years)

<u>BOATS:</u> Expire Dec. 31<sup>st</sup>

ATVs: Expire June 30<sup>th</sup>

**SNOWMOBILES:** Expire June 30<sup>th</sup>

MOTORCYCLES: Expire March of every year, except antique.

<u>DOGS:</u> Licenses expire Dec. 31<sup>st</sup>. New license tags are usually received by the middle of Oct. so you may license your dog(s) <u>any time after October 15</u>. Up-to-date rabies forms required. Also spay/neuter forms required if not on file in this office.

State required late fee of \$25 above the cost of license beginning Feb. 1

### ALSO, TAKE NOTE...

When <u>transferring your auto registration</u> from your vehicle to a new/newer vehicle, you <u>MUST</u> bring in the registration of the vehicle you are <u>transferring from</u>.

Greetings from RSU #24, I hope this finds each of you enjoying the wonderful fall weather. With the exception of the storm on October 17, the weather has been beautiful. There continues to be a buzz in the schools with students and staff alike taking care of the business of education. It has been a pleasure to get into our schools to observe the excitement that our schools generate.

The new building project continues to move forward. The architect has been refining the designs of the school looks at the classroom level details that will be included in the building. There have been meetings between the architect and the teachers and other staff members to solicit input on how classrooms should be set up and how the design of the school can be maximized to meet the needs of our students and our community. We are still on a path that has us braking ground in June! We are certainly excited to get the project underway!

Paralleling the work of the Building Committee, there is a fundraising committee charged with raising funds for items in the building project that the Building Committee deems as important for our students and that the State will not pay for. The name of the committee is Friends of Sumner's Future and they will be meeting to plan specific fundraising initiatives to help pay for such items as additional equipment for the building, dugouts, a digital street sign, and aluminum bleachers for the competition field.
