COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMMITTEE FORMATION

The Town will soon be working with the Hancock County Planning Commission (HCPC) to update Sorrento's existing Comprehensive Plan. A comprehensive plan is a summary of current conditions in town and a guide for the future. The current Plan, approved in 1995, is out of date and must be completely redone. The Selectmen will begin extending invitations to participate on the committee to a cross-section of Town residents.

FROM JOEY CLARK, SORRENTO ROAD COMMISSIONER

This winter, if you have a vehicle parked in the roadway/side of the roadway/in the Town right-of-way, anywhere hindering the snowplows, your vehicle can and will be towed, **AT YOUR EXPENSE**.

Also - remember that when you are plowing, it is illegal to plow the snow into the road way.

TAKE NOTE BURNING TRASH IS ILLEGAL!!

State Laws (12 MRSA 9321-25) governing the backyard burning of household trash are enforced by the Maine Forest Service.

If you think someone is burning trash **please call 973-3700 immediately!** 24 hours/day, 7 days a week.

TAKE NOTE

Due to changes from Augusta as to how marriage licenses and copies of birth, marriage and death certificates are done, this notice is to inform you that, especially with marriage licenses, we will need at least three business days from the time you give us your completed intentions papers to the time you may pick up your marriage license or other copies.

The **2017 PROPERTY TAX BILLS** have been mailed. They are **due December 18, 2017**.

The **2015 PROPERTY TAXES liens** are recorded in the Hancock County Registry of Deeds. Mortgage holders were notified.

The **2016 PROPERTY TAXES** were mailed November 3, 2016. They were due on January 17, 2017.

The lien process has begun on any **unpaid 2016 property taxes**.

2018 DOG LICENSES

2018 Dog Licenses and tags have been received in this office. They are due by January 1. Starting February 1, the State charges a \$25 late fee per dog, along with the license fee.

****Dogs must be licensed by January 1 or when they reach 6 months of age.**

If you license your dog(s) **after January 31** (unless it is a new dog), you will pay a **\$25 late fee** per dog along with the license fee, per State law.

****When licensing your dog, you must bring with you your dog's rabies certificate showing the tag number and date of expiration and your certificate of proof of spay or neuter, unless these are already on file at the Town Office.**

****If you lived and paid for your dog's license/tag in another town in Maine and now live in Sorrento, you must come in to the Town Office and exchange for a Sorrento license/tag. There is no fee for this.**

****Any dog living in the Town of Sorrento must have a**

Sorrento license/tag.

Traditional hand-written burn permits are still available, but the online system (\$7) allows permits to be acquired 24 hours a day, seven days a week, throughout the state, provided that the fire danger is not high.

OCTOBER 15 TO APRIL 15. 

***Regular burn permits are available
year-round.***

FOR BURN PERMITS ANY TIME OF THE YEAR:

You are required by Maine law to have a permit to burn, even for a small pile of grass clippings or leaves. **A Forestry Warden** will be called if you burn without a permit, possibly resulting in you being summonsed to court and fined.

The person who signs the fire permit is responsible for the fire. Do not leave any fire unattended.

*****at least two adults to attend the burn,***

*****some form of water supply and hand tools must be on hand,***

*****and it is recommended you have a cellular phone or other communication device to call for assistance should the fire escape.***

YOU are responsible to see that the fire is out before leaving.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING PICK UP



The months of **October through May** will have curbside recycling pick up **only the 4th Thursday** of those months.

The months of **June through September** have pickups the **2nd and 4th Thursdays** of those months.

Dates for the next two months are –

January 25

and

February 22



Through the winter months, trash bags (with a sticker on each bag) may be set out for pickup without being in trash cans. This is due to problems of getting the cans to the roadside through snow and such.

This will run through to the first pick up in April (or depending on the weather). Then we will go back to the Sorrento ordinance which states that the trash bags must be in trashcans.

Watch this newsletter for the change back.

EXPIRATION DATES

VEHICLES: Expire a year from when they are registered (unless you are transferring)

TRAILERS: Can be registered for 1 or 2 years, same month, except over 2000 lb. trailers expire in Feb. (1 or 2 years)

BOATS: Expire Dec. 31st

ATVs: Expire June 30th

SNOWMOBILES: Expire June 30th

MOTORCYCLES: Expire March of every year, except antique.

DOGS: Licenses expire Dec. 31st. New license tags are usually received by the middle of Oct. Up-to-date rabies forms required. Also spay/neuter forms required if not on file in this office.

State required late fee of \$25 above the cost of license beginning Feb. 1

ALSO, TAKE NOTE...

When transferring your auto registration from your vehicle to a new/newer vehicle, you **MUST** bring in the registration of the vehicle you are transferring from.

IF YOU ARE IN NEED OF

HEAT ASSISTANCE:

Call 211 – a 24/7 call center program providing information about programs and services available to Maine people.

LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) Fuel assistance with oil, kerosene, wood, pellets, propane or electricity.

Home Weatherization & Energy Related Repairs – Programs to fund improvements to make a home more energy efficient and comfortable. These could include home insulation, caulking, weather stripping and furnace repair or replacement.

Eligibility Screening for Other Assistance Programs. Approved LIHEAP applications opens opportunities for other available programs.

Energy Crisis Intervention Program (T.H.A.W. Fund) – is a one time, emergency assistance benefit for ¼ tanks or less or disconnection. This is a low-income, first come, first served basis program funded by donations to WHCA for fuel assistance.

The Historical Society has recently received a number of items once belonging to **Frank L. Trundy of Sorrento**. Among them is the following notice: Frank L. Trundy, Sorrento, opens a new ice cream parlor at Post Office Building on June 12, 1915. Ice cold drinks, cigars, tobacco, Samoset and Clover Leaf chocolates.

Also from Frank L. Trundy's ledgers:

Large heads – "Start and take up 18 knots. Then knit across 10 times then knot 3 10 times, and then knit together.

Small heads – "Start and take up 16 stitches or knots, then knot down 6 or 7 knots, then 2 stitches 12 times, then knit together.

Recollections of Calf Island

We have in the historical society a tape recording of Rev. Samuel Eliot interviewed by Hank Sharpe and James L. Gamble which was recorded in Brookline, Mass. in 1948. This recording focused on Rev. Eliot's recollections from

his age of ten.

Hank: "What about your father's negotiations with the Widow Bean to buy Sorrento Point?"

Eliot: "My father intended to buy just the tip of the Point... Father did conduct some negotiations with her. We were just camping on Calf's Island, and he was looking for a permanent home... So he went to negotiate with the Widow Bean in 1876 or 1877. And he offered her a good, but frugal price for her property. She refused to sell! She had heard that some silver had been discovered at the head of Sullivan Harbor."

Hank: "She did sell later."

Eliot: "Then Frank Jones came along...there wasn't any silver, so he bought the entire property."

From Mrs. Harry Woods' column, Mutual Benefit Column, in the September 25, 1946 Ellsworth American.

I went on a pilgrimage last week to visit a holy place. It is the Chapel of St. Francis-by-the-Sea in Sorrento – a children's chapel. We pilgrims wended our way along the high, grassy shore above the rough beach. Across a narrow bridge we went, over a little brook to dark fir trees, amongst which stood a small gray building of weathered shingles – a shack. Once it was a stable for a pony, a storage area for lobster traps, fishing equipment, and a place for the mending of nets. We stepped over the threshold and found ourselves before an altar, in the center of which the face of the Boy Jesus from Hoffman's "Christ among the Doctors", looked out at us gravely. On a wall were watercolors of the sea, shore, and Mt. Desert hills done by the children under the direction of Mrs. Hendricksen. Near this was a banner of green, white and red constructed of cedar, a starfish and everlastings. Probably constructed by the children under the help and guidance of the other wise teacher, Mrs. Hotson. There was a nook for the renderings of and to St. Francis. A former manger now serves as a seating place. We went out, after a while, of the little chapel by the sea. (edited by Jeanne Edwards)

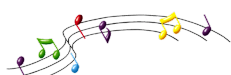

Monday through Friday.

Saturdays will be 8am to 11:30am.

Access to delivery receptacles will not change as a result of the realignment of weekday window service hours.

Customers will have access to their mail receptacles 24 hours a day. Post Office Box mail will be available daily for pick up by 11am Monday thru Friday and at 9:30am on Saturday.
